Re: Request for a Donation for the Mariannridge High School Mathematics Tutoring and Enrichment Project

Dear Members of the Atisa Board,

Following recent discussions with your B-BBEE consultant Mrs Nicole Ramjee, we would like to request a donation of R 25 000 for the 2024 fiscal year to be used for the Mariannridge Mathematics Tutoring and Enrichment Project as part of your Socio-Economic Development initiatives.

The Mariannridge Mathematics Tutoring and Enrichment Project (for more details see the webpage <https://umhlatusana-education-fund.org/>) brings university student tutors from the University of KwaZulu-Natal (UKZN) to Mariannridge Senior Secondary School on Saturdays to deliver free mathematics instruction to high school learners. This program, initiated as a small pilot project in mid-2020, has grown and now serves approximately 200 learners from grades 8, 9, and 10. Approximately 32 tutors are brought to the school on Saturdays when both the school and UKZN are in session. Mariannridge is a peri-urban township outside of Durban originally established in the 1970s for the Coloured population, but presently the vast majority of the students is Zulu. Over 97% of the beneficiaries of this project are Black South African as per the B-BBEE Codes of Good Practice.

This project is a partnership with the Mariannridge Senior Secondary School. Under a Memorandum of Understanding with the school, the school is responsible for safety and discipline at the school on Saturdays and for advertising the project and the enrollment of learners. The UEF, in collaboration with the Rotary Clubs of Durban Umhlatusana and Pinetown, recruits the tutors, provides their transportation to and from the school as well as a modest stipend for the UKZN volunteer tutors (below the market rate for tutoring). Additionally, the UEF provides textbooks for the learners and refreshments for the tutors during the breaks. The UEF also subsidizes the presence of personnel from the school to provide supervision on Saturdays. None of the UEF officers or Rotary Club volunteers receive any compensation for their services, which is provided on a strictly volunteer basis. Consequently, the project is extremely cost effective. We have discussed with Ms Nicole Ramjee the requirements of the B-BBEE Codes of Good Practice and we engage to follow all the requirements in the execution of this project and provide whatever documentation you may require.

This project, initiated by the Rotary Club of Durban Umhlatusana, is managed by the Umhlatusana Education Fund (NPC registration number 2022/383364/08), which in 2022 was successfully registered as a South African Non-Profit Company and also as a Public Benefit/Section 18a Organisation with SARS (Tax reference number 9236978251 PBO reference number 930076439).

This contribution will help a great deal to open up opportunities for the Mariannridge High School learners both in terms of accessing university and other post-high school career opportunities, as mathematics is the basis of modern science and technology, which are becoming increasingly central in all areas of society and economic life.
